STATEROOM SAFETY NOTICE

As your safety is our prime concern, we would like to remind you of some important precautions you must take while in your stateroom or on your balcony.

- Never use lighted candles, naked flames or any other burning material either in your stateroom or balcony.
- If you smoke, please use the ashtrays provided for your stateroom or balcony and ensure your cigarette is fully extinguished.
- Please do not smoke in bed or throw away cigars or cigarettes over the ship's side.
- Heated electrical items (such as a curling iron) used in your stateroom should not be left plugged in and unattended. When finished with the item, please ensure it is unplugged immediately.
- The use of irons and non-thermostatically controlled water heaters is strictly prohibited.
- Do not hang clothing out or leave personal items unattended on the balcony.
- Before retiring for the evening please bring all personal items inside.
- Do not place any items on top of the light fittings.

SMOKING ON BOARD QUEEN ELIZABETH

To respect all guests aboard QUEEN ELIZABETH, all public spaces are designated as non-smoking within the ship with the exception of Churchill's Cigar Lounge which is a lounge dedicated to cigar and pipe smokers. Outside, on the open Decks, the outdoor promenade on the starboard side of Deck 3, along with the forward and aft area of Deck 10 are designated as smoking areas.

- All restaurants are non-smoking. This includes outdoor dining alternatives.
- Smoking is permitted in all staterooms/suites and on private balconies. However, cigar and pipe smoking is not allowed.

CUNARD SOFT DRINK PACKAGE

The Cunard soft drinks package, a one-time payment which allows you to enjoy unlimited fountain sodas and selected juices for the entire voyage (in-transit guests will be required to purchase again for the next leg of the voyage). The package will only be available for purchase on the first and second day of the voyage and must be purchased for the full duration of the voyage. To enjoy this facility, take your ship's identity card to any of the cocktail bars on board where the staff will be delighted to assist you. The package entitles the bearer of the card only, to unlimited fountain sodas and selected juices served by the glass in any of the restaurants and cocktail bars. The price per day is \$4.95 per person with a 15% service charge. This package does not extend to bottled waters, in-cabin beverage service or to any other non-alcoholic cocktails / beverages.

MEDICAL SERVICES

The Medical Centre is open twice a day for routine, non-emergency consultations with the Ship's Doctor. These opening hours can be found in your ship's guide. For emergencies only, please press the speed dial button marked 'emergency' on your telephone or dial 999 or 911. Tablets for sea sickness are available from the Purser's Desk.

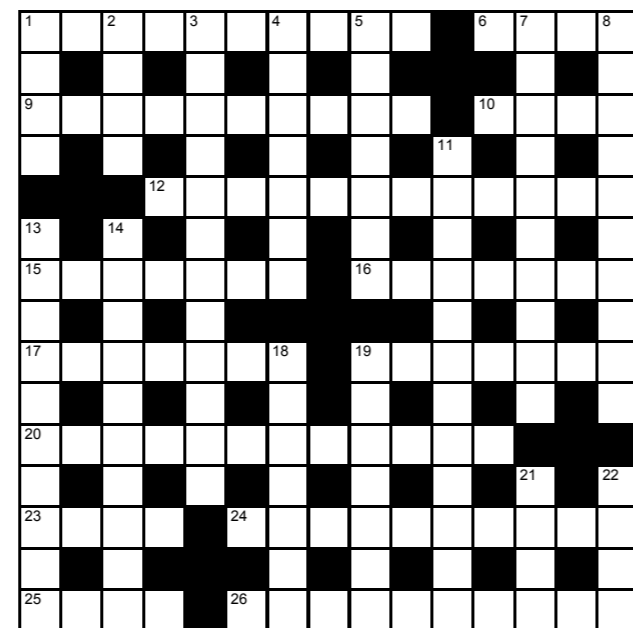
TIME CHANGE NOTICE

Please be advised that early on Tuesday morning, the ship's time will be SET FORWARD ONE HOUR. Please set your watches before retiring this evening, Monday 8 November.

SECURITY PRECAUTIONS

In order to prevent unauthorised persons boarding the ship, you are required to carry your 'Ship's Identity Card' with you when going ashore. You will be asked to produce this at the gangway when you leave and return to the ship. Please ensure that you also have a Government issued picture ID with you before leaving the ship, as you may be required to show this at security checkpoints upon your return. Be aware that we have established a secure area around the vessel and our security procedures require that you must be prepared to show your ship's identity card when entering this area, in addition to showing it to the security staff at the gangway when leaving or boarding the ship. We kindly ask you to not accept and bring on board any parcels or packages for strangers. Before boarding the ship, you may be asked by our security staff to open parcels or handbags which you are carrying. We are sure that you will appreciate that this security is in the best interest of all concerned.

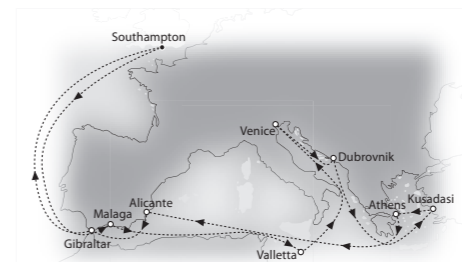

This map will appear everyday to chart our progress during the voyage.

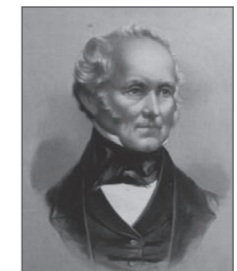
SOUTHAMPTON UNITED KINGDOM

The Bargate: the southern most entrance to the town in Medieval Times



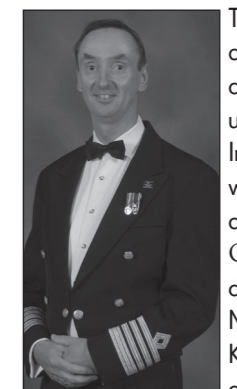
