Miami, Florida, USA

Miami is located in southeast Florida, between the Everglades and the Atlantic Ocean. Miami's nickname, "The Magic City", comes from its rapid growth. Winter visitors remarked that the city grew so much from one year to the next that it was like magic.

No other city in the United States is like Miami. Since its incorporation in 1896, Miami has grown tremendously. The city has gone through times of turmoil and triumph. However, its increasingly diverse population has been able to turn a tourist-oriented city into a glowing, cosmopolitan, international metropolis.

Brief History

Miami holds the distinction of being the only major city in the United States founded by a woman, Julia Tuttle, who was a local citrus grower. The Miami area was better known as "Biscayne Bay Country" in the early years of its growth. Julia Tuttle subsequently convinced Henry Flagler, a railroad tycoon, to expand his Florida East Coast Railroad to the region. Miami was officially incorporated as a city on July 28, 1896 with a population of just over 300.

After Fidel Castro rose to power in 1959, many Cubans sought refuge in Miami, significantly increasing the population. In the 1980s and 1990s, various crises struck South Florida - among them, drug wars, Hurricane Andrew, and the Elián González case. Nevertheless, in the latter half of the 20th century, Miami became a major international, financial, and cultural center.

Highlights

Miami is celebrated for its white sandy beaches, azure waters, tropical breezes, sunny skies and dazzling year-round weather. The city features tantalizing cuisine, pulsating nightlife, endless shopping and exhilarating outdoor activities. Highlights include:

- Miami MetroZoo: Miami's state of the art animal kingdom.
- Miami Seaquarium: a 35-acre oceanarium that features killer whales, sea lions, dolphins and sharks, along with many other salt-water species.
- Jungle Island: offers shows and exhibits featuring tigers, orangutans, reptiles, talking parrots and other wildlife.
- Vizcaya Museum and Gardens: this extraordinary European-inspired estate includes a native forest and a historic village, all on ten acres of gardens that overlook beautiful Biscayne Bay.
- Everglades National Park: take a guided airboat tour to spot alligators, soft-shelled turtles, and exotic wading birds.
- South Beach: world-famous, this section of Miami Beach features the "Art Deco District", a community of 1920s and 1930s architecture. This historically restored section of the city is the center of Miami's nightlife.

Whether you choose to dance the night away, enjoy mouthwatering new taste-sensations at a local gourmet restaurant, take in an exciting sporting event, get a taste of the arts, embark on a shopping adventure or simply lay on the beautiful beach... your time in Miami is sure to be full of fun-filled activity.

Immigration Inspection

The Immigration Inspection for all U.S. and Non-U.S. Citizens will take place in the Terminal Building as you disembark the vessel in Miami.

When attending the Immigration Inspection please ensure you have your passport and proof of citizenship readily available. Green Card Holders should carry their Alien Registration Cards (ARC) with them.

Please also ensure that you have completed and signed your Customs Declaration Form before disembarking the ship, as it will be checked and stamped by the Immigration authorities in the terminal.

Any payments due can be made outside in the terminal after the start of disembarkation.

Reminder

Please remember the following:

- Return all books to Guest Relations.
- Check all closets and drawers to make sure you have left nothing behind.
- Please remove all items from your stateroom safe.
- If you have lost anything please inquire at the Guest Relations Desk, Deck 5.
- All casino chips or tokens must be redeemed before the end of the cruise. These items are not redeemable by mail.

Settlement of Accounts

Guests settling accounts with a credit card that was validated at embarkation:

...are not required to contact the Guest Relations Desk, as charges have been billed automatically to your credit card company.

Guests settling accounts with Cash or Travelers Checks:

...will receive a note in their stateroom requesting them to settle their account at the Guest Relations Desk, Deck 5, the day prior to disembarkation by 10:30pm. Please note that you may continue using your SeaPass™ Card during late evening hours, and settle your account again by cash and travelers checks (both only in U.S. Dollars) on the morning of disembarkation from 6:00am – 8:00am. Due to end of cruise accounting procedures, all accounts must be closed by 8:00am the morning of your disembarkation. Should you have any inquiries after you have settled your account, please ensure to contact the Guest Relations Desk no later than 8:00am the morning of your disembarkation. After this time we are not able to make any changes in your account.

Room Service

Please note that room service will not be available after 1:00am on the last night of the cruise. We apologize for any inconvenience.

Shore Excursions Tour Departure Details

Guests participating in a shore excursion today, are asked to refer to departure time and the location indicated on your tour ticket. Please assemble 15 minutes prior to departure time. No announcements will be made, so please be prompt and remember to bring your tickets with you. Shore Excursions staff will guide you to the appropriate transportation. Enjoy your excursion.

U.S. Customs Allowances

Please note the following U.S. Customs allowances:

U.S. Residents:

- Purchases up to \$800 per person, including purchases made on the ship and in foreign port of call (for a combined total of \$800 per person can be taken back duty free into the United States of America.)
- A limit of 1 carton of 200 cigarettes - you must be 18 years or older. Excess U.S. Cigarettes marked with "U.S. tax-exempt for use outside U.S. or "Made for Export Only." will be seized. Foreign manufactured tobacco products will be subject to duty and internal revenue taxes.
- A limit of 100 cigars (No Cuban cigars allowed) Must be 18 years of age or older.
- 1 liter of alcohol is duty-free, including purchases made on the ship. You must be 21 years or older to take alcohol back to the United States of America. Applicable internal revenue taxes and duties will be assessed on alcohol overages.

Non-U.S. Residents:

Staying longer than 72 hours in the U.S. \$100 duty-free value, one quart of liquor per person over 21, and one carton cigarettes.

If you have exceeded your allowance, you are required to pay the appropriate duty to Customs Officials.

Please note the following information if you are returning home to:

Canadian Citizens:

\$750 duty-free value, 1.15 liters of alcohol and 200 cigarettes or 50 cigars. The \$750 limitation includes purchase price of alcoholic beverages, cigars and cigarettes. Canadian Customs allowances are not combinable as in the U.S.

UK Citizens:

£145 Duty-Free value, 1 liter of alcohol and 200 cigarettes or 50 cigars. The £145 limit includes purchase price of alcoholic beverages, cigars and cigarettes. British Customs allowances are not combinable as in the U.S.
