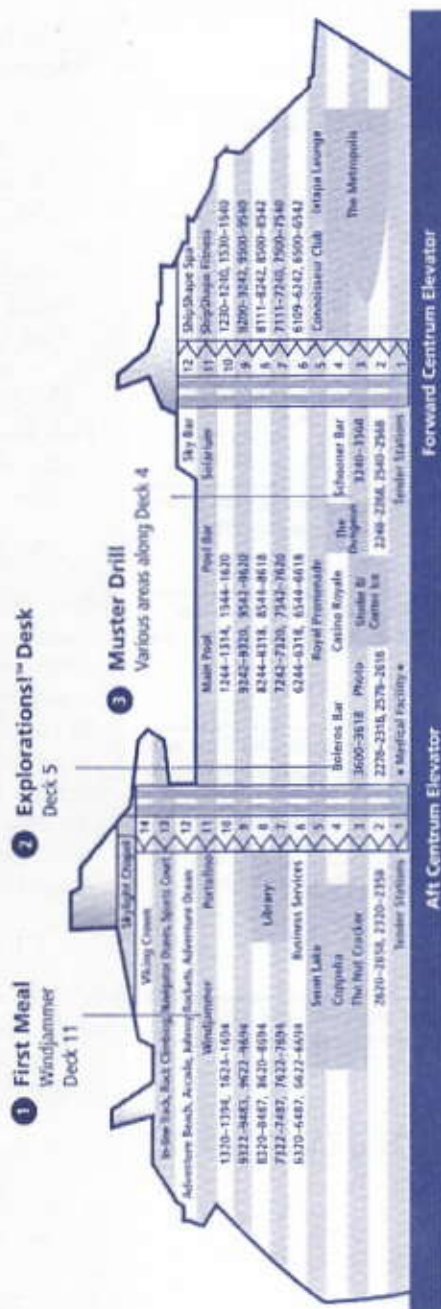

Guest Assembly Drill

A mandatory emergency drill will be conducted at **4:30 pm** on the Promenade, Deck 4. This will help you to familiarize yourself with the safety routine onboard and your Muster Station, your assigned meeting place in the event of an emergency.

Shops On Board

Duty free shops are located on Deck 5 and will remain closed whenever the ship is in port. Once we set sail and have reached international waters, the shops will open. Check the daily opening hours in your Cruise Compass.

Soda Package

An exclusive unlimited soda package is available for purchase in Two Poets Pub, Cafe Promenade & Pool Bar. Also available outside the Windjammer Café, Deck 11.

Frequently Asked Questions

Why do I have to activate my SeaPass and how do I do that?

The Navigator of the Seas works on a cashless sales system. Think of your SeaPass card as your onboard charge card. To activate your SeaPass card we require either a cash deposit or a credit card. Any remaining cash credits will be refunded to you on the last day of your cruise vacation. Parents are responsible for any charges made by their children during your cruise vacation. If you require any cards to be deactivated, please see our staff at the Guest Relations Desk on Deck 5. Cards should be kept away from cell phones money clips and other magnetic devices that could demagnetize the card. Please be advised that all credit and debit cards are approved on a daily basis. This means all debit cards will have funds removed from the account holder each day.

What time will my luggage arrive to my stateroom?

Due to the high volume of luggage handled during the boarding process, we will deliver luggage up to 9:00 pm. If your luggage has not arrived by this time, please contact the Guest Relations Desk on Deck 5.

How can I get my dinner seating changed?

Your seating arrangements are printed on the front of your SeaPass card. Our Maitre d' will be available for any table or seating request changes from noon - 3:30 pm in the Coppelia Dining Room, Deck 4.

Adventure Ocean Children's Program.

We encourage those guests with children ages 3-11 to register in our Adventure Ocean Program on Deck 12 aft. "open house" 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm.

What security measures does this ship have?

We take your safety very seriously. In order to prevent unauthorized persons from boarding the ship, please have your SeaPass Card ready to present to the officer at the gangway to swipe through our SeaPass system when you go ashore and return to the ship. On occasion, you may be asked to open your handbags or parcels. This extra security measure is a demonstration of our concern for all guests' safety. Please do not agree to take packages onboard from people you do not know.

Do I have access to a safe? How do I use it?

Each stateroom features a safe and instructions for use are posted next to the safe. Your Stateroom Attendant can also explain how to use the safe. If you should encounter any problems using your safe, please contact maintenance by dialing 1800.

How do I book shore excursions?

You can browse and book your Explorations! shore excursion right now from your stateroom. Simply press the green "menu" button to start and select "Explorations!" For further assistance, stop by the Explorations! Desk on Deck 5. Opening hours are listed in your daily Cruise Compass.

What are the charges for using the telephone?

Charges do not apply when dialing stateroom to stateroom; you simply use the 4-digit stateroom number. However, if you want to make an outgoing phone call, a charge of \$7.95 per minute will be billed to your SeaPass account. Charges also apply to toll free calls. Dialing instructions are located next to your phone and in your Cruise Services Directory.

How can I get a wake-up call?

You can program wake-up calls on your phone by pressing the speed dial button and entering your preferred wake up time using 4 digits and a 24-hour clock. For example
7:15 am = 0715 and 2:30 pm = 1430.

When will my stateroom be ready?

Your stateroom will be ready at 1:00 pm. In the meantime, a delicious lunch buffet is available for all guests in the Windjammer Café, Deck 11 aft, from noon until 3:45 pm.

Our Café Promenade serves light snacks. The Sky Bar, Deck 12, Pool Bar, Deck 11 and the Boleros Bar, Deck 4 are open from noon.

Valet Service

A dry cleaning service is available onboard. Just fill out the form located in your stateroom and leave it with the laundry bag for your Stateroom Attendant to pick up. For safety reasons please be advised that the use of personal irons is not permitted.

Room Service

Is available 24 hours except on the last day of your cruise vacation (until 1:00 am). Please dial extension 3416.

USEFUL INFORMATION

Adventure Ocean Back Deck – Please note the back deck behind Adventure Ocean is for ages 12–17 only.

Alcohol-Free Zone – Be aware that the areas at and around the Adventure Ocean and Challenger's Arcade areas located on Deck 12 Aft are strictly alcohol-free zones. Please respect our youth activities areas.

Alcohol Policy – Royal Caribbean International guests are expected to be responsible for their actions at all times, including during transfers to and from ships, inside terminals, while onboard, at our ports-of-call, during shore excursions and at our private destinations. Consuming alcohol to excess impairs one's judgment and reduces one's ability to recognize and avoid potentially dangerous situations. Guests who choose to consume alcohol must do so responsibly. The minimum drinking age for all alcoholic beverages on Royal Caribbean International ships is 21. A guest's age is established upon boarding at the beginning of the cruise vacation. Guests celebrating their 21st birthday during their cruise vacation may update their records by appearing at the Guest Relations Desk with his/her parent or guardian and present a government issued form of identification. Ship's staff may refuse to serve alcoholic beverages to any guest who does not consume alcohol responsibly and may request verification of a guest's age to determine whether they are of age to consume alcohol pursuant to this policy. Guests are not permitted to bring alcoholic beverages onboard for any purpose. Alcoholic beverages purchased from onboard shops or in ports-of-call (which must be presented to security upon re-boarding), will be secured by ship's personnel and delivered to the guest's stateroom on the last day of their cruise vacation. Security may inspect containers (water bottles, soda bottles, mouthwash, luggage, etc.) at any time, and those concealing or attempting to conceal alcohol will be subject to action pursuant to the "Consequences Section" of this Guest Conduct Policy. Guests under the age of 21 who possess alcohol in violation of this policy will not have alcohol returned to them and appropriate consequences will be considered, including but not limited to loss of privileges to use the disco or other areas or facilities of the ship.

Broadcast Television – Royal Caribbean International is proud to offer a variety of local and international programming. Brief moments of satellite signal loss can be expected at any time – an inevitable consequence on a moving ship. In addition, some major sporting events may not be available due to blackout and broadcast rights restrictions. We hope you enjoy the widest variety of stateroom television entertainment available at sea!

Electronic Listening Devices – Please refrain from using electronic listening devices in public areas unless used with headphones. Also, for the enjoyment of all guests, please refrain from the use of walkie-talkies and hand-held radios during all show performances and in all dining venues.

Entertainment Seating – Please remember, no saving of seats. We also kindly ask that all children sit with their parents.

Food Items Ashore – To comply with local and shipboard regulations, guests are not allowed to take food items ashore or back onboard from any port of call. Guests attempting to take food items ashore or onboard will be required to leave these at the gangway before leaving or boarding the ship. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Guest Conduct Policy – For the safety, comfort and enjoyment of all Royal Caribbean International guests, we have developed certain guest vacation guidelines for both adults and children. These guidelines cover a variety of areas, including but not limited to: smoking, verbal abuse, violent and/or unruly behavior, excessive, offensive language, possession of an illegal substance and vandalism. If Royal Caribbean International determines that any guest is in violation of these guidelines, we may be forced to ask the offending party to leave the ship at the next available port-of-call. Please make sure you familiarize yourself with these guidelines. A copy can be obtained at the Guest Relations Desk or in the Cruise Services Directory. Solicitation is not permitted onboard as it is considered a disturbance to other guests. Guests found soliciting will be asked to cease the behavior and all collateral (if any) will be confiscated and discarded. Continued non-compliance will result in the offending party being asked to depart from the ship at the next available port-of-call.

Important Health Information –

- **United States Department of Agriculture Warning** – In ports-of-call, please remember to eat and drink safely. To avoid illness, drink only bottled water.
- **United States Public Health & Centers for Disease Control Regulation Information** – Animal products such as meat, eggs, dairy produce, poultry or seafood that is raw or undercooked significantly increases risk to vulnerable and immunodeficient guests.
- With seasonal viruses appearing in the U.S., Europe and around the World, Royal Caribbean International, working in conjunction with the Centers for Disease Control, has instituted enhanced cleaning procedures onboard all its ships. You will likely see some of these activities during your cruise. Medical experts strongly suggest travelers pay close attention to washing their hands. The experts tell us that the best way to prevent colds, flu, and gastrointestinal illnesses is to simply wash your hands thoroughly for 20 seconds with soap and hot water after bathroom breaks and again before eating anything. Your cooperation and assistance with this matter would be greatly appreciated.

Medical Care – Medical facility charges are based on U.S. Government Medicare Physician Fee Schedule rates. Guests who wish to be seen outside of the posted hours will be charged an additional fee of \$30. The Medical Facility is located near the portside stairs/elevators on Deck 1 Aft. Tours of the Medical Facility are not permitted.

Navigator Day Spa & Fitness Center – Any cancellations must be made 24 hours before appointment to avoid a 50% charge.

Save The Waves – Please refrain from throwing anything overboard either in port or at sea. Please deposit trash in the proper receptacles around the vessel. We are doing everything we can to protect the ecology of the oceans that support cruising and are grateful for your cooperation.

Smoking Policy – To improve our guests' cruising experience, Royal Caribbean International has implemented a new smoking policy. We are increasing smoke-free zones by designating all staterooms, as well as the Champagne Bar and Vintages, as non-smoking areas. Smoking, however, is permitted in the smoking sections of all other lounges. Cigar and pipe smoking may be enjoyed exclusively in the Connoisseur Club, Deck 5, forward. Contact the Guest Relations Desk for more information.

Swimming Pools – Please be advised that the Solarium and Solarium hot tubs on Deck 11 are for adults only, over the age of 16. All families and children are welcome to use the two main pools on Deck 11. A parent or guardian must accompany guests under the age of 16 wishing to enjoy the main poolside hot tubs. In the interest of public health, children in diapers or who are not toilet trained are not permitted in the swimming pools or hot tubs at any time. We thank parents/guardians in advance for helping us to monitor these guidelines. If a lounge chair remains unoccupied for 30 minutes or more, our Deck Patrol has been instructed to remove the towels and personal effects. This policy enables all guests to share equally in the enjoyment of the facilities.

Telephone Calls – If you have your cell phone you can make and receive calls or text messages while at sea! Check out the Cellular Service brochure at the Guest Relations Desk. Service provided for any of over 340 service providers worldwide. While in port or arriving/departing from port your cell phone can connect through the local service provider if available. Calls may also be made directly from your stateroom phone. The rate for calls from your stateroom is \$7.95/minute, billable to your SeaPass account. This charge also applies to 1-800 numbers and calling card calls.

Wake-up Calls – Speed dial and enter your preferred wake-up time in 4 digits using the 24-hour clock. For example 7:15 am = 0715 and 2:30 pm = 1430.

Youth Evacuation Plan (YEP) – All children ages 3-11 must wear a YEP wristband indicating their assembly station at all times. If your children are participating in an Adventure Ocean program, our highly trained Youth Staff will take them to meet you at your assembly station. All children will be supervised until they are reunited with their parents/guardians. Children who do not already have their YEP wristbands may obtain them at Guest Relations, Deck 5 or from the Youth Staff at Adventure Ocean activities.

Please note that prepaid gratuities cannot be cancelled and the vouchers are non-refundable.

As You Depart

Important Departure Information

For your convenience, all guests will be assigned a departure lounge according to the different colored luggage tags they have received. Please proceed to your assigned Departure Lounge at the scheduled time, as announcements will only be made in the respective departure lounges. Please refer to the back of this flyer for designated Departure Lounges and approximate departure times. The Departure Desk on Deck 5 will be open from 2:00 pm until 6:00 pm on the last (Sea Day), for any assistance you may need with your departure arrangements.

Five easy steps to check out

STEP 1 The Night Before

- Remove all old tags from your luggage except for personal identification
- Attach one of the colored tags delivered by your Stateroom Attendant to each piece of luggage.
- Place each piece of luggage outside your stateroom between 7:00 pm and midnight on the last day. Please make sure that you do not pack your flight tickets, passport / proof of citizenship, medication and that you keep some clothes for your departure.
- It is recommended that you do not pack fragile items, medication and valuables in your luggage, but to keep them in your hand luggage.
- Under no circumstances should you carry a parcel or piece of luggage that does not belong to you.

STEP 2 SeaPass Account

If you have chosen to settle your SeaPass account with a credit card, there is no need to check out at the Guest Relations Desk. All charges will be automatically billed to your credit card. If you have decided to settle your SeaPass account in cash, please visit the Guest Relations Desk at any time no later than midnight on the last day. For your convenience, a statement of your account will be delivered to your stateroom on the morning of departure. Should you have any queries regarding your account, please see the Guest Relations Desk no later than 8:00 am. **You may continue to use your SeaPass card on the morning of departure if the account is billed to a credit card.**

STEP 3 Mandatory Customs and Immigration

The United States Customs and Immigration forms can be easily and quickly filled out. However, should you need assistance, please do not hesitate to ask.

U.S. citizens who have exceeded their exemptions in merchandise, liquor, or are carrying monies in excess of \$10,000, must present themselves to a U.S. Customs Inspector.

By law it is imperative that you declare these items to the Customs Official.

Your Customs exemption of \$800 allows you Duty-Free status on:

- Purchases up to \$800 per person.
- 1 carton of 200 cigarettes - must be 18 years or older. Excess U.S. cigarettes made for export only will be seized. Foreign manufactured tobacco products will be subject to duty and internal revenue taxes.
- 100 cigars (No Cuban Cigars allowed) - must be 18 years or older.
- 1 liter of alcohol - must be 21 years or older.

All persons must present themselves to a U.S. Immigration Officer. This includes U.S. Residents and Citizens. This inspection will take place in the terminal after departing the ship. Please have your passport open to the photo page and a completed Customs and Immigration form (Non-U.S. Citizens only) in hand. **Please remember not to pack your passport in your luggage.**

The United States Department of Agriculture prohibits the transportation of any agricultural products, such as fruits, vegetables, plants or meats into the United States. Any prohibited items taken off the ship will be seized and a fine may be imposed.

EXPRESS DEPARTURE

Guests who have minimal luggage and are able to hand carry their own bags when departing the ship are invited to take advantage of the Express Departure program. Please be reminded that no one will be available to assist you with your luggage as you depart the ship. Guests are reminded that only those ready to leave at 8:00 am and 8:15 am and who do not require assistance may participate in this program. Restrictions apply.



Wheelchair assistance:

Guests who require wheelchair assistance are kindly asked to meet in Boleros on Deck 4 at 8:00 am for 8:15 am departure.

In-room safe:

Please leave your safe open and unlocked before vacating your stateroom.

In-room beverages:

Please remember to sign any outstanding checks for beverages consumed in your stateroom.

Announcements:

Please be reminded that announcements will be made only inside each assigned departure lounge.

STEP 4 Staterooms

Please ensure that you check your safety deposit box within your stateroom to ensure that all your personal belongings have been removed.
